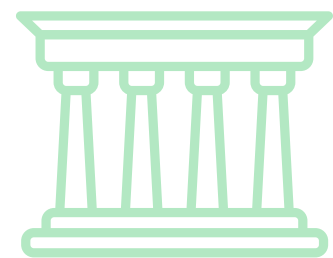


HISTORIC ITALIAN AMALFI COAST ADVENTURE

DAY 1: Pompeii to Sorrento

Distance: 27km
Approx. 33 minutes



Tour around the historically famous city of **Pompeii** which was frozen in time by **Vesuvius volcano** in 79 AD. Pompeii also hosts a vast range of historical sites and beautiful landscapes like the **Vesuvius National Park**, the **Antiquarium** and the vast range of Archaeological sites and Architectural masterpieces. After experiencing all that Pompeii has to offer, begin your road trip and drive to **Sorrento**. We recommend making a detour to **Monte Fato**, one of the highest peaks in the **Lattari Mountains** before arriving in the stunning and exuberant coastal town of Sorrento.



Once you have arrived in Sorrento you will notice the plethora of things to do and cultural experiences to indulge in. Whether you want to learn, relax or explore, there are plenty of options for any traveller. Take an authentic Italian cooking class at **La Limonaia**, Shop on the famous **Corso Italia**, relax by the beautiful crystal blue beach **Bagni Salvatore**, or complete a self-guided **historical walking tour**. Whatever you decide we know you'll enjoy!

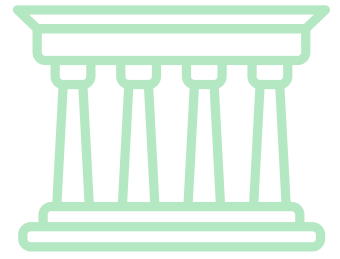

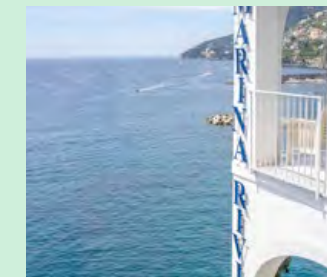

This is the perfect destination to end this self-drive road trip; where you can not only experience all that Salerno has to offer, but also what encompasses the Amalfi Coast. DAY 1:

Milan to Bologna

Distance: 300km

Approx. 3 hours 20 minutes



Milan is a majestic city that offers plenty of beautiful sights, cultural and historic experiences as well as shopping and fine dining. Cross this city off your bucket list and experience it in your own time on a wondrous road trip. Visit the [Duomo Di Milano Cathedral](#), in the heart of the city, and one of the city's most beloved and sacred sights. Spend a relaxing day in the Navigli District, designed by Leonardo Da Vinci. This charming canal is the home to some incredible restaurants, bars and shops with a beautiful view. For a once in a lifetime experience, book tickets to the [Teatro alla Scala](#), one of the most incredible and beautiful theatres in the world.



HELPFUL TIP

When driving on the Autostrade or motorway, the left lane is only used for passing the car in front of you, once you have passed the car in front, move back into the right lane.



Once you have visited and experienced all that Milan has to offer, pack the car/motorhome and road trip to the historic city of Bologna. Visit the incredible [Porticoes of Bologna](#), a world heritage site and a captivating historical pathway that stretches approximately 62 kilometres. Climb the [Torre Degli Asinelli Tower](#), also known as the two towers located in the heart of Bologna. The towers offer spectacular views of the entire city. Whilst on your road trip in Bologna you should also visit the [Giardini Margherita](#), a beautifully crafted garden with fountains and an abundance of nature.

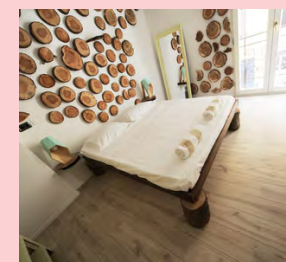

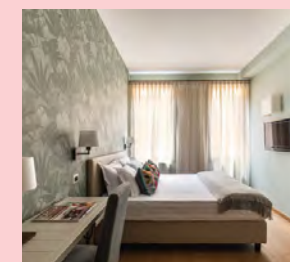

Approx. 1 hour 26 minutes



When you are ready to depart Bologna, visit the sophisticated Florence, home to some amazing museums and architectural buildings that represent the renaissance city perfectly. When in Florence you should visit the [Uffizi Gallery](#) which features some of the greatest renaissance art such as the famous Birth of Venus painting as well as some breathtaking sculptures. For all the foodies out there, you must check out the [Mercato Centrale Firenze](#) which is a large market place with all of the best Italian goods as well as some amazing cafes and eateries. 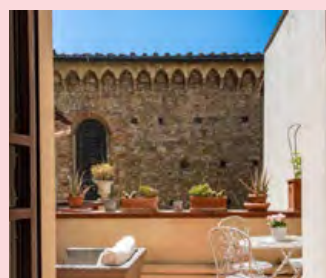
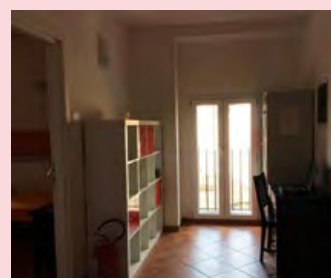

DAY 3: Florence to Arezzo

Distance: 74km
Approx. 1 hour 3 minutes



Your next stop on this self-drive road trip is the charming city of Arezzo, with lots of architecture and art for any history buff to sink their teeth into. Visit [Casa Vasari](#), the home of painter, historian and architect Giorgio Vasari. His home is adorned in frescoes and paintings, which was later turned into a museum and a fantastic experience. Another unique experience in Arezzo is to visit [The Colours of the Joust Museum](#) which is an interactive museum dedicated to the Saracen Joust. This museum has everything from clothing worn to the jousting sticks

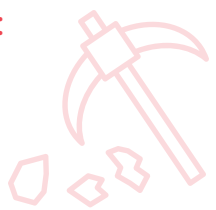


and even a re-enactment performance which is thrilling and exciting for those mediaeval lovers. However, if you want something a bit different from art and museums and you happen to be in Arezzo on the first Sunday of the month, consider going to the bustling [Piazza Grande](#). On the first Sunday they host an antique market with approximately 500 vendors from across the country. 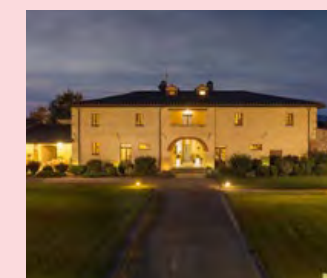
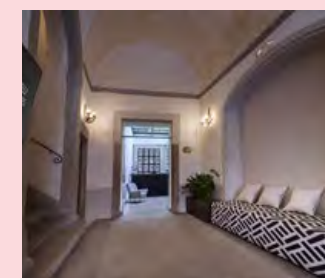

DAY 4: Arezzo to Terni

Distance: 172km
Approx. 1 hour 50 minutes



Next on our north to south road trip is the romantic city of Terni, protected by Saint Valentine himself. Terni is a beautiful city surrounded by stunning landscapes, architecture from all eras and fantastic fine dining restaurants. Tour around the town centre and explore the intricate architecture, visit the restaurants and cafes and have a relaxing walk around with the locals. For those ancient history fanatics, visit the **Carsulae Archaeological Park** established approximately 220 BC for a deeper exploration of Italian history and ancient architecture. A must do is to experience the exclusive fine dining of Terni such as **MeGusta Ristorante** and **Umami**. Finally, follow the butterflies into the magical **Marmore Waterfall Park** where they have waterfalls, streams and a butterfly house surrounded by forest and luscious landscapes. Terni is such a special place with a lot of experiences that you cannot get anywhere else.

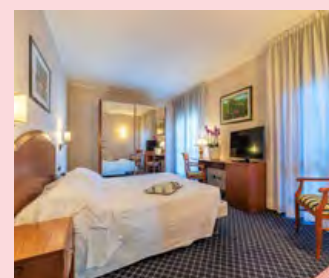
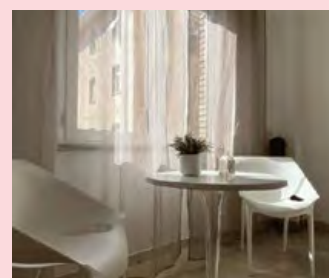

DAY 5: Terni to Rome

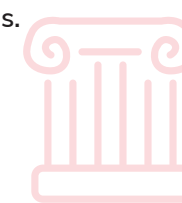

After visiting Terni and experiencing all it has to offer, continue on your journey to the Eternal City of Rome. Rome is well known for its ancient Roman history, architecture and cuisine. Some notable and popular attractions include the **Colosseum**, the **Trevi Fountain**, **The Pantheon** and the **Vatican Museums**. All fantastic to see and experience in person, however, we have a few more attractions and things to do in Rome that we think you should check out! Visit the Castel **Sant'Angelo**, also known as the Castle of the Holy Angel. This Mausoleum has beautiful architecture, art and sculptures that are a must see in Rome. 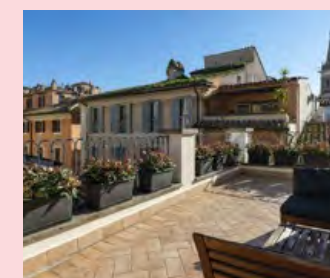

Approx. 1 hour 6 minutes



Say Ciao to Rome and Buongiorno to Latina - our next stop on this road trip. Latina is a relatively modern town in comparison to some of the previous cities. However, there is still plenty of culture, history and sights to see in this beautiful city. Stop off and visit the whimsical **Giardino di Ninfa**, an enchanting and fairytale-like garden that's perfect for photography and a natural getaway. Declared a natural monument, this historic garden is well known for its charm and beautiful scenery with an abundance of history. After your visit to the beautiful gardens, stop at the **Ristorante Il Quadrato**, one of Latinas best restaurants with a comfortable atmosphere and impeccable food. Another fun and diverse attraction in Latina is the **Museo Piana Della Orme**. This modern museum features exhibits from World War II as well as some exhibits on the Pontine Marshes. Another historical and famous street in Naples is **Via San Gregorio Armeno**, where you will find a varied amount of niche trinkets and goods to purchase. Ideal for souvenirs as well as christmas products and decorations, this street is a must see and

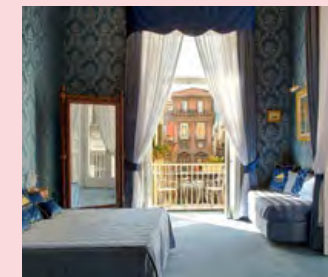

THE PERFECT PUGLIA ROAD TRIP

DAY 1: Foggia to Barletta

Distance: 100km
Approx. 1 hour 10 minutes



Puglia is a beautiful region in southern Italy and is the home to farmland, ancient architecture and a stunning coastline that looks over the Mediterranean ocean. To start this radiant road trip, begin in the industrial centre of Foggia, a city famous for its agriculture and architecture.

Drive through the countryside of Italy until you arrive at the **Gargano National Park**, home of two UNESCO sites, beautiful scenery and the cerulean coloured ocean. Another few fun things to do whilst in Foggia is visit the **Cattedrale di Foggia**, the roman-catholic cathedral of Foggia. Built in 1172, this romanesque style cathedral is a must-see for history buffs and lovers of incredible architecture. Another amazing structure in Foggia would be **Chiesa Delle Croci**, or 'Church of Crosses'. Known for its baroque styled architecture, long walkway and beautiful gardens, this is another bucket-list item you need to see in Foggia!

Once you have finished sunning it up and experiencing all the culture and history of Foggia, it's time to continue the road trip to Barletta. Barletta is a



beautiful and ancient coastal town with incredible architecture and sits on the Gulf of Manfredonia. Some notable attractions include the **Colossus of Barletta**, a large statue of Emperor Heraclius I. Not only is this statue a marvellous sight, it also has a rich history behind it. For those interested in architecture, the **Basilica of the Holy Sepulcher** is a phenomenal church from the 18th century. The Church has beautiful gothic architecture and is located right by the Colossus of Barletta. After marvelling at the historic town of Barletta, visit the **Teatro Curci**, a beautiful theatre adorned by red, gold and an incredible roof fresco. So book tickets to an incredible show and enjoy the stunning architecture of this incredible theatre.

DAY 2: Barletta to Bari

Distance: 60km
Approx. 50 minutes



Next on our Puglia road trip is the beautiful city of Bari. Explore Bari's incredible 'Old town' which is a series of winding streets, restaurants, shops and historical buildings. We recommend doing a [walking tour](#), discovering all the best places to shop, eat and drink whilst learning about all Bari has to offer. We also recommend visiting the [Poggiofranco Markets](#) in Bari. These markets occur every Saturday morning and are a popular activity and tradition in Bari. Another recommendation we have is the [Museo Civico Bari](#), a small museum dedicated to the history of Bari and includes all of their artefacts, art and photographs collected over the years. A must-do in Bari is to visit the [Trulli of Alberobello](#), a delightfully charming dwelling that will transport you into a magical world. Listed as a UNESCO world heritage site, we definitely recommend visiting and experiencing all it has to offer.

Approx. 1 hour 11 minutes



Once you have finished with the delights of Bari, travel across the coast to Taranto, known for its spartan history and beautiful beaches. Whilst in Taranto visit the [Castello Aragonese](#), the floating castle. This is an immaculate site with vivid views and plenty to see and do, we highly recommend a trip to this amazing islet. If you love a good museum, check out the [Museo Taranto](#), which is the National Archaeological Museum of Taranto and has excellent exhibits with a lot of history to learn from. However, if you happen to be in Taranto on a Sunday, book in to see the [Taranto Spartan Museum](#). They do guided tours every Sunday at 11:00AM and show the ancient underground village where Spartans lived and hold a great range of artefacts from the Spartan period. Aside from these great attractions we also recommend checking out the [Taranto Cathedral](#). Once you've explored all of Taranto's sites, hit the beach and enjoy the gulf of the Ionian Sea and its crystal clear waters; or stroll through the miraculous old town and experience all of the beauty that Taranto has to offer.

DAY 4: Taranto to Brindisi

Distance: 61km
Approx. 45 minutes



columns. If you are enjoying seeing all of Brindisi's architecture and historic sites, then check out the [Church of Santa Maria del Casale](#). This Romanesque-Gothic church was built in the late 13th century and has a striking appearance with its use of different stones. It creates a beautiful two-toned structure and is visually incredible. Brindisi is also well-known for its incredible cuisine and seafood, being a harbour city and so close to the ocean; we recommend a [cooking class](#), so you can take the knowledge of Italian coastal cuisine home.

Next on this self-drive road trip planner is the beautiful city of Brindisi, known for its beautiful beaches, ancient harbour, mediaeval castles and local cuisine. We know you'll have a fun and sunny time in Brindisi. Start off with a stroll down Corso Roma, the main commercial street of Brindisi, which is lined with a range of shops, cafes, restaurants and cute boutiques. After shopping and coffee sipping, check out [Castello Alfonsino](#). Built in the mid 1400's, this castle is part of the city's ancient harbour and was originally built as the port's first defence system. Whilst in the harbour, stroll around and see some of the incredible roman architecture like the two roman

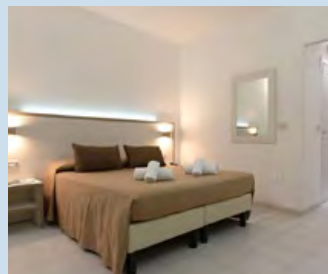

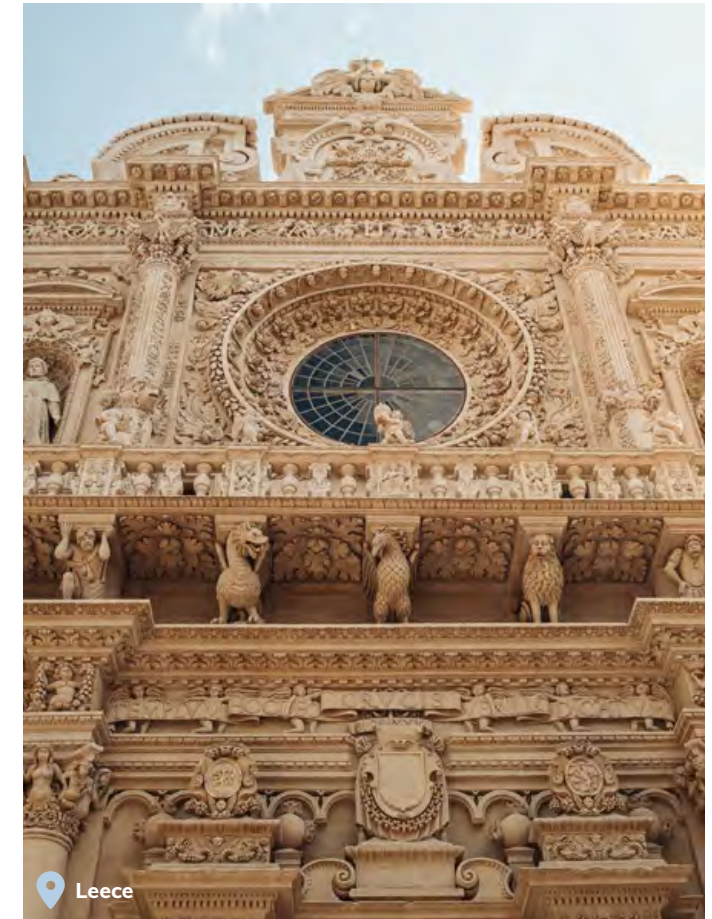


DAY 5: Brindisi to Lecce

Approx. 31 minutes



After experiencing all of Brindisi, hit the road and make your way to the captivating city of Lecce. Known for its festivals, baroque architecture and friendly locals, Lecce is a wonderful city with an abundance of activities. Stroll through the historic centre and experience the charm of Lecce's older buildings and homes. Visit the ancient [Roman Amphitheatre](#), built in the 2nd century, the amphitheatre was used for gladiator battles amongst other historic events. This historic site is a wonder to behold and a deep dive into ancient Roman history. For another historic attraction, check out the [Basilica Santa Croce](#), the temple of history, art and the parish of Lecce. Built in the 17th century, this baroque-style church is absolutely breathtaking and a must see in Lecce. For something a little something different, check out some of the authentic cooking classes for offer. One that stands out is the [Orecchiette Cooking Class and Wine Tasting](#) for a rounded taste of Lecce.

For our final stop on this 'Perfect Puglia Road Trip', head to Gallipoli and experience the last of the incredible architecture, stunning beaches and deep cultural history that the Puglia region has to offer. Begin your journey and experience all of Gallipoli with a **walking tour!** This tour takes you from the new town, where you visit the renaissance style Greek Fountain, inspired by the ancient Greek Gods. You then cross the immaculate stone bridge, constructed in the 16th century and connects the new town to the

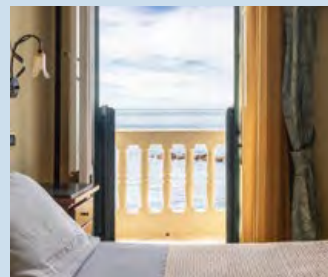

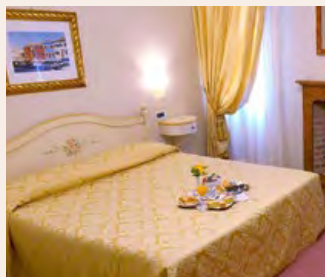

Distance: 200km

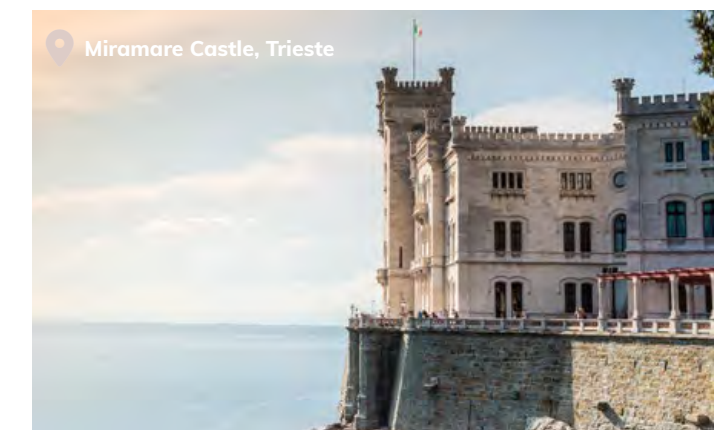

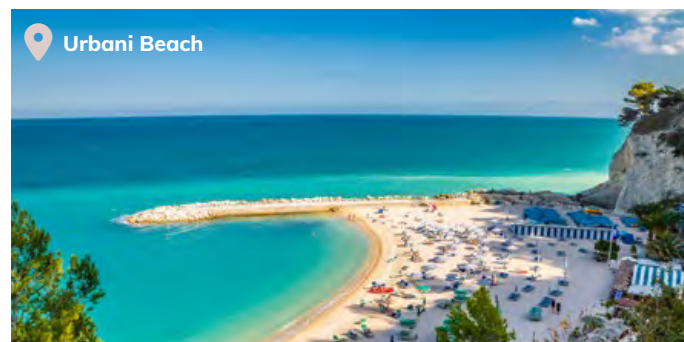


DAY 4: Rimini to Ancona

TIPS: Italy Driving Tips

- Vehicles drive on the **right hand** side of the road.
- The legal **blood alcohol content (BAC)** limit in Italy is 0.05mg/100ml. Police have authorisation to carry out random alcohol test on drivers at **any time**. Motorists found over the limit face heavy fines from loss of licence, vehicle impounded, fines up to imprisonment. If found over the limit at the event of an accident, insurance companies have the right to refuse claims.
- Observe and stay **below speed limits**. Speeding cameras, handheld devices and portable detection devices are used by police to catch speeding drivers. Fines are issued for speeding drivers.
- In Italy mostly all **autostrade** require a toll. Since Italian motorways form a network, toll prices are determined on distance travelled. Motorists entering a motorway will need to collect a ticket from a automated machine, the ticket must then be presented at the toll gate upon exit where a toll can be calculated. However on some motorways a fixed price is charge regardless of distance travelled. Tolls can be paid by cash, credit card, prepaid card or by electronic tags.
- Children under 150cm in height are **required** to be seated in the back seats of the vehicle and be fasted in either a seat belt or appropriate child restraint.
- Mobile phones **cannot** be used while driving, with the exception of a hands free system.
- Street parking within major cities such as Naples and Rome are virtually non-existent but once one is found **strict restrictions** apply. You'll be much better off finding off-street parking located away from the main hustle and bustle and catching transport in. If using street parking, park in bays marked in either blue or white. **Blue bays** are paid parking where a parking ticket will need to be purchased and displayed on your front window screen. **White bays** are free parking but require the use of a parking disc that displays your time of arrival on your front window, discs can be obtained from petrol stations. Make sure before leaving your vehicle to check street signs as time, parking restrictions **may apply**. Vehicles illegally parked or have exceeded their limit will have their vehicle towed or clamped and left with a hefty fine.
- **Speed limits** can change, so it is important to keep an eye on changing speed limits.
 1. **Urban Roads** (built up areas): 50 km/h
 2. **Rural Roads** (outside towns): 90km/h
 3. **Dual Carriageways**: 100km/h
 4. **Motorways**: 130km/h

Vehicles that are towing caravans or trailers must travel at a slower speed.

Can I choose Automatic or manual transmission in Italy?

DriveAway offers both automatic and manual transmission cars to hire. However, manual vehicles are much more common in Italy and hiring a manual vehicle is much cheaper than an automatic one.

Can I take my car/motorhome on the ferry?

Travel on the ferry to some of Italy's islands is on a request basis. If confirmed, the vehicle is not covered by insurance when on the ferry. If you want to take the vehicle on the ferry to one of Italy's islands, please request this at time of booking with one of our friendly reservations members or online team.

What are the restricted driving zones in Italy?

When preparing to drive in Italy, it's important to be aware of the **Limited Traffic Zones** (Zona Traffico Limitato / ZTL) found in larger cities. Most historic city centers, like Florence for instance, have ZTL's set up to reduce overall congestion around popular attractions, and also to help slow the degradation to these areas caused by the constant influx of visitors each year. Drivers who enter a ZTL without proper authorization will be fined, and in most circumstances tourists and non-local visitors are not issued passes - only locals are permitted to drive through these zones. The fines

for violating a ZTL boundary ranges depending on the city you're driving in, but on average is about 65 EUR, not including the "Traffic Violation Fee" (usually around 25 EUR per fine) charged by your rental supplier.

Do I need a full driver's license in Italy?

A full valid driver's licence is required for a minimum of 1 year. An **International Drivers Licence** is required for Australian drivers licence holders.

Do I require an International Driver's permit (IDP)?

Yes, an international drivers license is required. If you drive in Italy without one, you can be fined a large amount. It is highly recommended to get an international drivers permit to be safe and avoid receiving fines. This can be done by going to the NRMA, RACQ, RACV, RAA, RAC, RACT and the AANT depending what state you are from.

Is there are minimum or maximum age limit?

Generally the **minimum** age is 21 years, but can vary between the car/motorhome hire company and location. **Maximum** age limits apply in some locations, a **young/senior driver surcharge** may apply. Please check terms & conditions when making an enquiry or booking.
